He taught us about 8 attitudes which are called the **Beatitudes**.

Matthew 5:1-12 The Beatitudes

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying:

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy.

Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. 12 Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you."

What is peace?

One kind of peace can be seen in the Biblical term 'shalom' which signifies an abundant, or flourishing life. A second idea is the modern notion of interior serenity. But this second type of peace is incomplete without spiritual growth with the peace of Christ.





LISTEN: Be a peacemaker

The seventh beatitude tells us:

'Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.'

What does it mean to be a peacemaker?



A peacemaker....



... deals with issues

... seeks reconciliation (makes up with people)
... does not make trouble
... brings people back together
...spends time in quiet prayer and reflection

This takes: time, effort, bravery, humility and honesty and requires great personal confidence.

- Be a bully
- Cause conflicts
- Encourage disputes to continue
