Easter

Easter Sunday is the greatest of all Christian celebrations. The fifty days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost are celebrated joyfully, as one "great Sunday". These above all others are the days for the singing of the Alleluia. During this time, we hear about the appearances of the risen Christ. The readings about the Good Shepherd are read on the Fourth Sunday. Other readings include the words of Jesus at the Last Supper. We also pray for the above intentions. The Ascension of Our Lord is takes place 40 days after Easter and Pentecost is celebrated 50 days after Easter when we remember that Jesus sent his Holy Spirit.






CAFOD National Assemblies - Thursday 22nd April

Relationships and Sex Education Updates

As you know, the statutory requirement to teach RSE comes into place this term. In advance of teaching RSE you are required to have written and consulted on your school RSE policy. A model RSE policy and guidance on writing a policy are available from the CES and are on our website here along with other support material from the CES including the model curricular.

We have also produced cross mapping documents and a 'frequently asked questions' answer document to help our schools plan and implement RSE. These can be found on our website <u>here</u>.

Through our training we have given lots of advice regarding the resources you use for RSE in your school. Most obviously the resources must not contain anything that that contradicts Catholic teaching on relationships. However, they should also promote a Catholic approach to relationships, so, any resources produced by a non-Catholic organisation will need significant adaptation. 

Made in God's Image



Governance Updates

Governor Hub Training – Recorded Session Link

It was wonderful to see so many clerks at the Governor Hub training last term. Please find a link <u>here</u> to the recorded training session for those who couldn't make it.

New process for appointing foundation governors / directors

- 1. We ask that your school appoints a Nominated Person (either the Clerk to Governors or perhaps, someone in the School Office) who will administer this process.
- 2. The Nominated Person should download the suite of forms [available at <u>Link to website</u>] and personalise them to the school, including the email address of the nominated person.
- 3. The Nominated Person will send the application to and receive the application from the applicant.
- 4. The Nominated Person will seek the references and the DBS certification. (Note: the parish priest may wish to return the reference directly to the diocese; if they wish to do this, they have been asked to let the nominated person know).
- 5. When all references and Clearances are available, the Nominated Person will upload all documents to the Diocese using this secure link at: <u>Link to website</u> A receipt will be sent to the Nominated Person and the Applicant on submission.
- 6. The Diocese will determine the complete application within 21 days, either with a letter and deed of appointment, or other communication.




Capital & Pupil Placement Planning Updates

Capital

VASCA 2020/2021

There are currently 84 live projects. 33% of projects are in 4 pre-start phases with 66% on-site or in financial account closure.




VASCA 2021/22

We are still waiting for the Government to announce the School Capital Allocations for 2021/22. The Capital Strategy Committee of the Education Commission with then release the first-round of 2021/22 projects for development.

Statlog

The number of schools with Statlog Licences has remained unchanged.

However, the number of sites setup for Statutory Compliance Management continues to rise.





Project Manager

The Statlog Project Manager Tool was released on Monday 1st March. A number of schools have requested access to the module, and this has been granted. To secure approval, each school needed to demonstrate the following:

- A current Statlog Licence,
- A recent Condition Survey, uploaded to Statlog, and
- An active Statlog Statutory Compliance regime

If your school can satisfy all of the above prerequisites, please email nigelspears@rcdow.org.uk with your access request.

The first 6 projects to be managed by Schools are progressing through the various stages of Project Manager. What has become evident is the significant level of risk assumed by schools with consequential implications for School Leaders and Governors.

Matched Funding – An indicative £10K has been assigned to each VA school from the 2020/21 VASCA Account. Schools authorised to use Project Manager will be able to assign this funding to any locally managed (minor works) project that commences before the 31st of December 2021. Statlog will automatically initiate the appropriate transfer process when a PM Project reaches the "In Contract" phase. The request will be issued to Nigel Spears (Central Funding Manager) who will review the project to ensure that the applicant school has adhered to the principles of Matched Funding. Transfer to the School Revenue Account will be processed by Marisa Borgerth (Central Funding Manager) from Diocesan Finance within 28 days of application.

'De minimis' level

There is a threshold below which any expenditure is not considered to be capital and should not be met from capital budgets. For all RCDOW Catholic Schools this is £2,000. The de minimis level also applies to the purchase of ICT equipment. This level has not changed for more than 20 years.

Priority School Building Programme

Project managers continue to monitor the progress of schools in this scheme.

Pupil Placement Planning

1st Planner Project

Next Monday, 26th April 2021, the Project Oversight and Scrutiny Committee as commissioned by +John Sherrington, will meet with the preferred potential delivery partners identified during the last few months. The main presentation will be from Faithful and Gould.

The 1st Planner Project Team is preparing to engage with Local Authorities to negotiate for (and secure) Capital Funding. The meetings will focus of the data shared with School leaders and the potential opportunities discussed. These meetings will be at Portfolio Holders, Council Leaders and CEOs as appropriate.

Pupil Placement Planning

Local Authorities throughout the Diocese are preparing for significant changes in the number of pupils seeking school places. If schools are approached directly, please contact Nigel or Peter to ensure the Diocese is in the loop.
