



Refugee Response

We have all been shocked and saddened by the humanitarian crisis in Ukraine. According to the UNHCR, 1,735,068 people are seeking refuge (as of March 6th), as well as countless others having been internally displaced by the conflict that is taking place. I invite you to read CSAN's statement.

In the statement CSAN asserts that:

‘the need to plan and resource a humanitarian response In England and Wales is rapidly becoming acute. We need to consider how we resource the needs of incoming refugees, as well as the poorest members of our society already facing a rising cost-of-living crisis.’

The statement outlines Home Office support for extending the Community Sponsorship scheme to welcome Ukrainians to the UK.

Detailed below is information on the scheme as well as some initial ways of responding to the needs of migrants, asylum seekers and refugees from Ukraine and beyond.

I would like to draw attention to our first Diocesan Asylum Seeker and Refugee Response Network Meeting of 2022, which takes place this Thursday. This session has a special focus on schools who want to be part of an integrated response to the needs of migrants, asylum seekers and refugees.

Nationality and Borders Bill

On the 28th of February The House of Lords voted to lift the ban, meaning that asylum seekers would be able to work. This is significant news – but in order for this to become a reality, both the House of Commons and the House of Lords have to agree. Tackling Knife Crime and County Lines

The second knife amnesty bin of the year was blessed by Bishop Nicholas Hudson on 9 February. It is located at St Mary & St Michael Roman Catholic Church in Tower Hamlets.

Bishop Hudson said: “In Lent, we think of the powerful words of the Lord spoken through the prophet Joel, “Come back to me with all your heart.” A knife bin announces the same call, to have a change of heart. The knife bin standing here now on Commercial Road announces peace. “Be peacemakers, not peace-breakers,” it cries out to everyone that passes it.”

This is the fifth knife bin installed in the diocese through the partnership of Caritas Westminster and Word4Weapons.

Minet Masho, our Development Worker for the area admitted: “The knife bins are not aesthetically glorious to see” – we would rather not be putting these objects outside our churches – but they are there to encourage people to give up knives and other objects that could be used as weapons, and to act as a call for peace on our streets.





All of the above have been submitted via route 2. This means that the responsible body chose to supply additional evidence of need. This evidence included Statlog Condition Surveys and some additional structural evidence where appropriate.

Insurance of Land and Buildings

In recent months, the Diocesan Trustees have been taking advice regarding the insurance cover for School and Academies occupying Diocesan Trust premises. Costs are escalating for all schools whether they insure via the CIS or are members of the Government's RPA.

The trustees have identified a significant financial implication for school who are members of the RPA. RPA members will be aware that the RPA will only offer £250,000.00 to protect occupied buildings and it is the responsibility of the school to secure appropriate insurance in excess of this amount to protect their buildings and business continuity.

The Trustees have been struggling to identify any insurance company that is prepared to protect the interests of the school for a reasonable premium.

To put the risk into context, you will all recall the major fire that consumed St Joseph's, Willesden. Thankfully, no one was injured, and the insurer paid for the building to be completely repaired and for the temporary buildings required to provide continuity of education. An outlay of circa £15M. If this school had been a member of the RPA at that time, the scheme would have paid £250,000.00 toward the rebuild, leaving the governing body over £14,750,000.00 to find from elsewhere. Neither the Governing Body nor the Diocese could fund the difference so the school would have been abandoned, the pupils sent to other schools and the staff made redundant.

The CIS scheme covers the potential of loss to the occupied school during any building project. If the cost of the work is over a certain level it changes an appropriate premium but, either way, the school is protected.

Members of the RPA are at liberty to secure occupiers' insurance to protect their school. If you find a company that is prepared to sell you comprehensive insurance at a competitive rate, please let us know so that we can share this with other RPA school.

It is possible to arrange for the contractor to cover your liability as part of a building contract. However, the full cost of this insurance will be passed on so the school will pay for the insurance either way.

Because of the significant risk of building loss for schools in the RPA. The Trustees are advising that every school occupying Diocesan Land and Buildings returns to the CIA scheme as soon as possible. We are in discussion with the RPA about this matter and may be able to reopen both options when the scheme protects the additional risk but, in the meantime, the CIA scheme offers all interested parties, the best level of comprehensive Capital and Business Interruption insurances.

1st Planner Project

Decarbonisation

Salix – Heat Decarbonisation Plans

Visits to Schools are progressing on schedule. Completing the reports in the allotted time is challenging and your assistance is greatly appreciated. We are in regular communication with Salix as part of their monitoring and assurance process.

Other Approved Initiatives

Condition Data Collection (CDC)

The Government has commenced the latest round of its Condition Data Collection process. It is a quinquennial programme and this round builds on the two that preceded it. Schools will be contacted by surveyors appointed by the Government. This process is monitored by the Education Service, but we do not normally attend any of the engagement sessions. The surveyors are expected to contact you in advance of any proposed site visit. Please contact nigelspears@rcdow.org.uk if you have any questions about this process. Insurance Validation

The Catholic Insurance Service and Zurich have commissioned an audit and appraisal of schools insured via the CIS. The Diocesan Trustees are paying for this initiative and targeted schools will be approached by a company called Charterfields. If your school is targeted during this initiative, please supply Charterfields with the data and access they required.
