Something very special happened to me and even though I was small I had to be very brave!



What is an Apparition?

An apparition is a supernatural (beyond the laws of science) appearance to a person or a group of people



What is a Marian Apparition?

A Marian Apparition is an appearance of

Mary, Jesus' mother.

Usually when Mary appears, she also has a message that she wants people to hear because it will help them to become closer to her son, Jesus.

The person she appears to is asked to be a special messenger and to tell people the important news.


Over the years there have been lots of people who have said that they have seen Jesus' mother, Mary. However just because someone *says* they had an apparition, it doesn't mean that they actually did.

Each time someone says Mary has appeared to them, it must be carefully investigated by the Bishop who lives nearby to check they are telling the truth and not mistaken.



The local Bishop investigated Bernadette's visions and said that she was telling the truth.






The first 7 times Mary appeared to Bernadette, it was joyful.

Bernadette was always deeply happy; this was seen in the way her face shining with joy and light

Apparitions 8 to 12 were penitential.

Penitential means that things became less joyful and felt a bit more sad and sorrowful.

The people who were coming to the grotto each day to watch Bernadette as Mary appeared to her, didn't always understand what was happening and why Bernadette was behaving as she was.





The last six apparitions *looked* outwards, beginning with the thirteenth apparition.

During this Apparition, Mary spoke to Bernadette saying:








Over the years there have been churches built at the place where Bernadette saw Mary. Lots of people visit and go there to pray and celebrate Mass.

What is a relic?


Relics help us to feel close to someone who we know is very close to God.



Why Pilgrimage?

A pilgrimage is a journey to a place that is holy. It is more than just a sight-seeing tour or a chance to visit historical sites. Although it involves a physical journey, it should also involve a spiritual journey too.

When we travel on pilgrimage it helps us to refresh and renew ourselves spiritually. We step outside of our busy lives and find space to connect ourselves to God.





Let's find out about some of the things that you can do when you make a pilgrimage to Lourdes

Visit the Grotto





Walk towards the Grotto of the apparitions and enter beneath the rock: you will see the spring and the famous statue of Our Lady of Lourdes; an unforgettable experience.

Bathe in the Waters

Go and drink at the spring and wash yourself there!



Enter a bath filled with water from the spring that flows in the Grotto of the apparitions and experience something unique.

(Following the covid pandemic pilgrims are invited to wash their face and hands rather than fully body)



Light a Candle





During the fourth Apparition, Bernadette arrived at the Grotto for the first time with a blessed candle. She held it in her hands throughout.

It is from this that the custom of lighting candles at Lourdes began.

Follow the Eucharistic Procession





You can take part in the procession in honour of Jesus, present in the Blessed Sacrament every day.

Join the Marian Torchlight Procession





Every evening at 9pm believers from all over the world join a torchlight procession and sing *Ave Maria* (Hail Mary). This is one of the most popular events in Lourdes

Why Pilgrimage to Lourdes?

Every year, hundreds of pilgrims from the many parishes in the Diocese of Westminster journey together to Lourdes to visit the Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes.

With the kindness of volunteers, the group is able to support over 100 pilgrims who are sick, disabled, frail or elderly and need help to make the journey.

When pilgrims make this journey, although they are part of a group they experience this pilgrimage in a personal way too.
