Respond

Let's stand with Mary Magdalene as she arrives at the tomb. The tomb is empty. She thinks she's lost Jesus forever. How is she feeling? (Silence). Perhaps you can hear her crying?

Suddenly Jesus appears to her — at first she thinks it's one of the gardeners. She doesn't recognise Jesus. Listen to his gentle question: 'Woman, why are you crying? Who are you looking for?'

Now listen as Jesus gently calls Mary by her name: 'Mary'. No-one calls her name like that, only Jesus. Her eyes are opened and she sees Jesus. How does she feel? (silence)

Let's join with Mary and gaze at the risen Jesus as Mary did (silence). Now let's see Mary as she runs back to the disciples, full of joy, to share the Good News.






