We thank you for being a compassionate God who walks with us in dark moments of grief and loneliness.


We are thankful for all who continue to love and support us through our grief.

#### **Advent**

Advent will begin on 3<sup>rd</sup> December this year. To support schools with this, an updated Catholicism Unpacked resource will be shared with soon. Please look out for this and share it with members of your community as this will support understanding of prayer and liturgy during Advent as well as subject knowledge. #### Advent is a time to:

- 1. Prepare for the Solemnities of Christmas in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered
- 2. As we remember this, we prepare our hearts and minds for the Second Coming of Christ at the end of time

During this time, we hear in the readings about the promise of the Messiah in the prophecies of the Old Testament and the preparation of Mary and John the Baptist. It is a time of joyful expectation.

The crib is used as a symbol for reflection during this season and believers often attend the Sacrament of Reconciliation and say the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary. This season lasts until Christmas Eve.

#### Instructions:


- 1. Ask pupils to design a Christmas card using this theme, as appropriate to their age. (It can be any medium but must not include the pupils' names)





**#RedWednesday** occurs on 22nd November 2023. Schools will be able to make use of this assembly to support teaching about **#RedWednesday** across Key Stage 2 and to encourage pupils to commit to action through prayer and fundraising.

The materials may support further engagement with the <u>LIVE STREAM</u> event. Equally, the materials may support a specific lesson in KS2 focusing on the work of a Christian Charity.

The primary materials talk about religious freedom, without going into the detail about religious persecution and encourage children to reflect on the fact that they can express their faith publicly without fear. They will come to realise, through engagement with these materials, that this is not the case for children across the world.

Margaret Attah's experience of religiously motivated violence is explored, and her faith and courage in the midst of such cruelty serve as a reminder to all not to be complacent about the freedoms we enjoy. Including videos, photographs and thoughtful questions, this resource explains not just how but why 'Breaking the Silence' is necessary.

With slide-by-slide explanations, the Supporting Notes give detailed instructions to enable this presentation to be completely student-led. The second presentation (Part 2), shows four ACN projects in Africa. This will help your students understand ACN's work and allow them to more fully grasp how their fundraising becomes a lifeline for others.

#### 1. Structural Change

To proactively challenge racial inequality and non-inclusive practice in school: Governance, Policy, School Leadership, Staffing

#### 2. Curriculum

To have a curriculum that is diversified and representative of society and ensures BAME pupils achieve and make progress; To ensure the curriculum is used to address RJED issues and promote anti-racism

#### 3. Communication and Training

To ensure all relevant parties are informed about RJED and have received relevant training on RJED.

#### 4. Promotion, Celebration and Collaboration

To actively promote and celebrate the RJED vision with all stakeholders in schools and colleges, the Education Service and the diocese, and to collaborate with other dioceses and relevant groups to support each other's work.



#### Saints from Racial and Cultural Inclusion

#### Saint Charles Lwanga:

St Charles Lwanga who was a Ugandan convert to the Catholic Church who was martyred with a group of his peers and is revered as a saint by both the Catholic Church and the Anglican Communion.

#### Saint Lorenzo of Manila

St Lorenzo of Manila, is a Filipino saint venerated in the Catholic Church. A Chinese Filipino, he became his country's protomartyr after his execution in Japan during its persecution of Japanese Christians in the 17th century.

#### Saint Rita of Cascia

St Rita of Cascia, was an Italian widow and Augustinian nun. One of the most popular Saints in the Church for centuries, St. Rita is known as the "Saint of the Impossible" because of her amazing answers to prayers, as well as the remarkable events of her own life.

Desirous of being a nun, she instead obeyed her parents and married. Her husband was cruel, and caused her much suffering, to which she responded with love and prayers, eventually converting him. After the death of her husband and two sons, Rita was able to enter a convent, where she devoted herself to prayer and penance.

#### Saint Euphrasia Eluvathingal

Euphrasia Eluvathingal (born Rosa Eluvathingal; 17 October 1877 – 29 August 1952) was an Indian Carmelite nun of the Syro-Malabar Church, which is an Eastern Catholic Church in Kerala. Euphrasia is said to have had a vision of the Holy Family, at which point the illness she had long felt ceased. She was canonised as a saint by Pope Francis on 23 November 2014 in Vatican City.

#### Saint Stanislaus of Poland

St Stanislaus of Poland was Bishop of Kraków known chiefly for having been martyred by the Polish King Bolesław II the Generous. Stanislaus is venerated in the Roman Catholic Church as Saint Stanislaus the Martyr (as distinct from the 16th-century Jesuit Stanislaus Kostka).



#### Saint Augustine Zhao Rong

St Augustine Zhao Rong - Father Augustine, was the first native-born Chinese priest and the first Chinese priest to be martyred. He was originally a soldier entrusted with the task of transporting to Beijing French Bishop John Gabriel Taurin. During the long journey, the bishop greatly impressed Zhao Rong with his kindness and peaceful demeanor in the face of persecution. Zhao Rong requested and received baptism after learning about the Catholic faith. Taking the name Augustine, he was later ordained a priest. After his arrest, he was offered the opportunity to renounce the Catholic faith but refused. After horrific tortures, Father Augustine died of his injuries in prison.

#### Saint Joseph Vaz

St Joseph Vaz - Catholic Oratorian priest from Goa. He is known as the Apostle of Ceylon. Fr. Vaz entered Ceylon (now Sri Lanka) during the Dutch occupation, when Calvinism was the official religion. He travelled throughout the island bringing the Eucharist and the sacraments to clandestine groups of Catholics. At the time of his death, Fr. Vaz managed to rebuild the Catholic church on the island. On 21 January 1995, he was beatified by Pope John Paul II in Colombo.

#### Saint Josephine Bhakita

St Josephine Bhakita - venerated as a modern African saint, and as a statement against the brutal history of slavery. She has been adopted as the patron saint of modern Sudan.

#### Saint Martin de Porres

Saint Martin de Porres from Peru patron saint of mixed-race people, barbers, innkeepers, public health workers, and all those seeking racial harmony, and animals.

#### Saints Perpetua and Felicity

In the eyes of the world, Saints Perpetua and Felicity were separated by status: one a well-educated noblewoman, the other a servant or slave, Yet, in life and in death, these two women from early 3rd century Carthage, North Africa, were sisters in Christ and both were martyred for their faith in A.D. 203, under the emperor Severus.

At the time of their arrest, Perpetua had an infant son, and Felicity was pregnant While she was in prison, Perpetua wrote about the circumstances leading up to their death in a diary that was later published as The Passion of Saints Perpetua and Felicity. We know of Perpetua and Felicity's story because of the diary Perpetua kept while she and her companions were awaiting execution. Not only is this text rare for its account of early Church martyrs in the days leading up to their deaths, but it is one of the earliest first-person narratives by a woman writer.

#### Statlog

#### **RAAC**

The use of Statlog in our schools enabled us to respond quickly to the challenges presented by RAAC. Using the evidence contained in the system, we identified all buildings in the school estate that constructed during the time period that RAAC was in general use. Using that data, we were able to engage directly with the DfE. The DfE deployed their retained specialists to over 60 schools and they assessed the buildings for RAAC. Thankfully, no new buildings have been identified.

#### Land and Buildings Collection Tool – Academies Financial Return

We are pleased to report that the 2023 LBCT process is complete and that all Trusts using the Diocese to verify Church Owned Land were submitted before the deadline. Thank you for the work completed at Academy Trust level that facilitated this data return.

No new projects are proposed for this term. The Capital Strategy Committee is awaiting guidance on the management of RAAC before committing any more of the reserve.

#### RAAC – Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete

Colleagues from Diocesan Property and Education teams continue to support all schools identified with RAAC. Where time is required to plan for significant change, mitigation projects are underway to protect building users from harm. Elsewhere, remediation work is in development to remove the RAAC. Some of our schools have been provided with Marquee Accommodation as a temporary substitute for their main hall until the roof is made safe or replaced. In other schools, staff have reconfigured their existing spaces to ensure the continuity of teaching and learning. 
#### **VASCA**
