#### Easter

As we look with hope towards Easter Sunday, we are reminded of the profound significance of Jesus' resurrection. By rising from the dead Jesus demonstrated victory over sin and death and gives us hope in the promise of eternal life.

## But Easter does not finish at Easter Sunday...

The Easter Season (Eastertide) or Paschal Season, is a liturgical period that **begins** on Easter Sunday and lasts for fifty days, concluding with the feast of Pentecost. It is one of the most significant seasons in our liturgical calendar. Throughout the Easter Season, we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus and reflect on the implications of this event for our faith and lives. It should be a time of joy, renewal, and spiritual growth, marked by special liturgies and traditions that emphasise the victory of Christ over sin and death. The Easter Season culminating in the



celebration of Pentecost, which commemorates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and the beginning of the Church.

We hope this Easter Season is a time of joy and spiritual renewal for your school community.



# **Prayer and Liturgy Directory Updates**





## **Embedding Catholic Social Teaching into the Curriculum**



St Joseph's Catholic Primary School, Ealing Deanery

We're all on a journey! 'Catholic Social Teaching' was a phrase we became aware of about six years ago. Most schools are working towards children understanding what it is and why we do it; some are ready to go further and begin embedding CST across their wider curriculum. At St Joseph's, we seem to have done it the other way round! Following a visit by our advisor, Jo Browne, we were invited to share what's going on in our school, so here goes...


In the beginning, we thought the way forward would be to make some relevant links between what we were already teaching, and the six principles of CST helpfully presented by Caritas Westminster. Each year group planned how and where a related question could be explored in a lesson

#### For example:

In Y1 Geography 'Weather and Climate', a link has been made with Community and Participation with the question: How can we behave as Catholics to help others faced with the effects of extreme weather?

In Y3, a link has been made between the Local History topic, the founding of the local convent and the CST principle 'Preferential Option for the Poor' by asking the question: Why should we follow the nuns' example?






Human Dignity has been explored through the choice of text in Guided Reading in Y4 and asking, 'How can we develop as a community which cares for those with a disability?'

These are just a few examples — we call them 'Catholic Link Lessons' and have a sticky label in the subject book where any work/evidence is presented. Links are not forced — they all make sense in the context of the topic and the CST principles — nothing is shoe-horned in! We are currently reviewing whether the links still fit as the curriculum develops and cohorts of children move through the school.



Separately, we have begun using the 'Rooted in Love' resources produced by Caritas Westminster – available on the DOWES website. These lessons are taught in the first week of each half term following a launch assembly and work/evidence is recorded in the RE books with a special 'margin marker' to show it as special and separate from the ongoing RE topic.

We also learn a hymn which fits the theme and sing it every week in hymn practice. During the rest of each half term, family activities related to that principle are shared in our weekly newsletter (available on our website). Our next steps are to actively promote this and ask children to bring things in to show how they've participated as a family.






Around the school site, we have display boards dedicated to each principle (see photos). These are updated with examples of the Rooted in Love lessons, family activities and Catholic Link Lessons.

Earlier this term, our Deputy Head devised a quiz trail where children went around and focussed their attention on the displays to be able to answer some questions engaging them with the content – they found out what other year groups had done and enjoyed

looking at work done in other classes.

We're still on the journey, but I hope to have been helpful in some way by sharing!






## Secondary RED Implementation


