Recruitment

Wraparound Childcare

The government has recently produced <u>Information Sheet</u> relating to wraparound childcare for primary school aged children, in advance of the national rollout in September 2024. The Information Sheet contains information as to early adopters of the programme, with links to both the *Programme Handbook* and *Guidance for Schools and Trusts*.

The *Programme Handbook* is aimed to support schools, providers and local authorities in working together to deliver expanded wraparound in their area, and describes the programme's vision and objectives, expectations of the programme, and includes details about what funding can be used for. The handbook also encourages providers to promote the availability, where appropriate, of government childcare subsidies to parents, including Tax-Free childcare and Universal Credit childcare.

The *Guidance for Schools and Trusts* outlines their role in providing wraparound childcare, reiterating messages in the handbook on roles and responsibilities across the system, as well as offering practical guidance for schools and academy trust companies to support parents in accessing wraparound childcare provision on a school site. The *Programme Handbook* and the *Guidance for Schools and Trusts* can also be accessed via:

Schools and academy trust companies are being requested to contact their local authority to discuss the support (including funding) available through the programme, and the places they currently have available and / or could create through the programme, to support the wraparound expansion.

Agency for Evangelisation Update

Thy Kingdom Come: Prayer for Evangelisation

Thursday 9th – Sunday 19th May 2024

Greetings from the Agency for Evangelisation. We would like to invite your school to light up the world in prayer for people to encounter Christ so that they can experience something of what Jesus offered, when he said, 'I came that they might have life and have it to the full.' (John 10:10)

It is a simple request, that Christians pray for five people they know to come to faith in Jesus Christ from the Ascension (Thursday 9th May) to Pentecost (Sunday 19th May). It could be as simple as praying the Our Father, our own favourite prayer or joining in prayers with others. Christians from many denominations around the world have been part of the wave of prayer for the last eight years.
