'The Big Listens' - official and alternative

If you have not already done so, please consider completing the surveys below and share with other interested parties.

Ofsted's 'The Big Listen' is open until 31 May, 2024. The consultation was produced in response to the Coroner's Report, following Ruth Perry's tragic death.

The survey asks about:

how Ofsted report inspection findings

how Ofsted carry out inspections

how Ofsted can have a positive impact on the sectors they inspect

what Ofsted need to do to be a world-class inspectorate and regulator, trusted by parents, children and the sectors they work with

There are two surveys, one for educational professionals, carers, employers, social workers and parents/carers and the other is for children up to the age of 18.

You may also have read about the 'Alternative Big Listen', launched on May 1st by former senior HMI who think Ofsted's Big Listen has avoided asking important questions about the future of school inspection. The survey closes on June 12, 2024.



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Prayer and Liturgy Directory Updates







Planning for RED Implementation



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Racial Justice, Equality and Diversity: Practice in Schools



School Context:

St Vincent's is a 1.5 form entry school with 286 children ranging from 4 -11 enveloped in a 15-acre site and with Forest School underpinning our curriculum. Children come predominantly from the parishes of Sacred Heart in Mill Hill and St Anthony's in Edgware. Numbers on roll have been fluctuating but have remained at the same level for the past three years. We are not currently at capacity with approximately 30 places to be filled, mainly in Reception and KS1. The cost of living and the building of higher end housing in the area has meant that we have been affected by some families moving away and new families into the area choosing to send their children to local private schools. This past year there have been some lower cost and social housing options in the new developments and we have seen a small influx of families from this group enrolling their children into Reception - that is likely this will continue opening the doors for us to offer a 24 place Nursery from September 2024.

Children currently come from a diverse range of socio-economic backgrounds; they speak 29 different languages and hail from 23 different ethnic groups. While predominantly Catholic (81%), we also have families who are from other world faiths or none. (Christian 6%, no religion 3%, other religion 3% Muslim 2%, Hindu 1%). The curriculum we present, and promote, to the children is an endeavour to reflect these differences by providing opportunities to explore the different countries, languages and customs our children are part of through the projects they investigate.

We have looked closely at the context of our school, the backgrounds of the children and how life is for a child growing up in North London today. We have used the underlying principles of our Catholic Faith and the example of our namesake, St Vincent, to devise a set of values which lie at the heart of our curriculum. With the diverse range of families in our school community we work to ensure that all children feel represented in the curriculum and have opportunities to share of themselves, their backgrounds, traditions and history.

Racial Justice Equality and Diversity naturally weave through everything we do on a daily basis. As a Vincentian School, following our own special Vincentian Values, we attempt to foster a sense of community, belonging and acceptance amongst our pupils, staff and wider community.

Our journey officially began in the Summer Term of 2022 with a whole staff meeting introducing RJED and spending time recognising the makeup of our school through analysing data. We shared the Action Plan, talked about our current position and identified next steps. At our school, our Subject Leaders work together in 'working parties' and the Cultural Group (made up of the RE, Literacy, SEND, Creative Arts and Humanities Subject Leaders), took on the day to day implementation of the RJED initiative with full support from the Senior Leadership Team.



WITNESS to the word

What have we done:

At the end of 2022, we held an 'Open Road Week' for our Year 6 pupils in preparation for their transition to secondary school. This included wellbeing, STEM and cultural activities. As part of the event, parents brought in food from their cultures for a tasting morning with the children.

We created a list of significant individuals from different backgrounds to support teachers in representing different cultures in their planning.

Each class was also provided with a large map for display. Each child was given a pin to stick on the map showing the country they were from – some children required more than one pin and this was celebrated.

During Advent 2022, our corridor display told the Nativity story through images from around the world. Each class was given a painting of part of the Nativity story from a different country to study. They compared their painting to the Gospels and commented on the artists views and choices.

Racial Justice Sunday 2023 was marked by all phase groups across the school. The children prayed for equality and took part in the Diocesan competition.

Following on from this, the cultural working party made suggestions of topics, texts and resources to make projects more diverse across the school. For example, in Spring 2023, UKS2 studied the Kingdom of Benin and wrote letters to the Prime Minister explaining why they believed he should return the Benin bronzes to Nigeria. In Autumn 2023, UKS2 studied the story of the Hidden Figures as part of their work on earth and space. They explored racial segregation and the discrimination shown towards these special women and how this affected their work at NASA.

To celebrate 125 years of our school in the summer of 2023, we took the children on a journey through time sharing the history of our school. This culminated in a special celebration focussing on the wonderful diverse community we are today. During mass, the children read the prayers of the faithful in their home languages, we said the Hail Mary in Italian and the hall was decorated with flags from around

Valuable learning from this process:

We were impressed with how respectful the children were and how they had a go at tasting everything. The parents were pleased to be able to come in and share with the children. Some let the children help them take part in the making and others prepared mini lessons.

The teachers were grateful for this resource as it saved them time, guided their planning and ensured they were representing different cultures.

The children enjoyed this activity (which we are repeating at the start of each academic year) as it prompted conversation and questions. The children were proud to talk about their home countries and share information with their peers.

This was probably the first time that our pupils (and maybe some of our teachers) had even seen Nativity images from around the world – particularly from Africa and Asia. It was very powerful in how it encouraged children's and adults' conversations in the corridor!


This topic began with an understanding of the British Empire. The discussions that were had from our study of Benin were invaluable. The children felt passionate about how the British disrespected the people of Benin and their culture, and made their own links to their work on Catholic Social Teaching – Dignity of the Human Person – and it was their decision to write letters to the Prime Minister.

The thing we really learned from this celebration, was how much the community enjoyed getting involved and sharing food from their own cultures. We were so surprised by how many parents turned up with food to share. Everyone was so respectful and enjoyed tasting foods that were new to them.

The parents were keen to get involved and we were overwhelmed with the number of images that were shared. We used the images in our teaching, on resources, in our Advent Family Prayer Packs and in our newsletters. It was important that children were seeing images they recognised and images that they could see themselves in.
This was a special week, as each day we explored one or two of the big questions in the book. Our whole week focussed on this text which incorporated all subjects, including RE. We met in an assembly at the end of each day to share our learning with each other and our special 'show racism the red card' books were sent home each evening to share with parents too. We had really positive feedback from pupils and their families and felt that addressing some of the ideas, including unconscious bias, has helped our community to recognise racism and discrimination in different forms.



Thy Kingdom Come: Prayer for Evangelisation

Thursday 9th – Sunday 19th May 2024

Greetings from the Agency for Evangelisation. We would like to invite your school to light up the world in prayer for people to encounter Christ so that they can experience something of what Jesus offered, when he said, 'I came that they might have life and have it to the full.' (John 10:10)
