





Lifting the Faith Schools Cap

Since 2010 the 50 percent cap or 'rule' has prevented new Catholic free schools from opening, as the cap would have forced schools to turn away some Catholic pupils. The Catholic Church has welcomed the decision by the Education Secretary, Gillian Keegan, to lift the cap on new free schools in England. The decision is subject to a consultation on removing the cap, that closes on 20 June. To respond to the consultation please click <u>HERE</u>

RE and Catholic Life Resources

Ordinary Time

Ordinary Time between Pentecost and Advent is the longest liturgical period in the Catholic Church. It begins the day after Pentecost, which celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit, and continues until the eve of the First Sunday of Advent, which marks the beginning of the liturgical year. The primary theme of this period is spiritual growth through reflection on the teachings and miracles of Jesus Christ as recounted in the Gospels.



During these weeks, the Church emphasises what is means to be a disciple of Jesus. We are encouraged to reflect on how we can

incorporate the teachings of Jesus into our daily lives, promoting a deeper commitment to living out the values of the Gospel. The readings and liturgies focus on various aspects of Jesus' ministry, including parables, healings, and interactions with his disciples and the broader community. This time is seen as an opportunity for spiritual growth, personal reflection, and community building, helping believers to strengthen their faith and prepare for the more intense liturgical seasons of Advent and Christmas. Through Ordinary Time, we are reminded of the continual presence of God in the ordinary and the call to witness to our faith in everyday circumstances.

The Year of Prayer - 2024



Prayer and Liturgy Directory Updates






Planning for RED Implementation

We are now planning the next steps on our implementation roadmap and would like your feedback and input. Both TenTen and Oxford University Press are currently working on published schemes, however, the suggested timelines for these are longer than hoped for. As a result, in 24/25 we are proposing to provide interim planning support in the form of workshops using the RED model curriculum for Year 1 building on the EYFS work this year. There would also be an option for repeat EYFS sessions.

Pearson Religious Education ELC

In recent months, the CES has worked with Pearson as they developed the Edexcel Entry Level Certificate Religious Studies. We are now pleased to confirm that the qualification complies with the Bishops of England and Wales requirements.

The Jerusalem Trust's Small Grants to Schools Scheme

The Jerusalem Trust's Small Grants to Schools Scheme supports the teaching of Christianity within Religious Education. The scheme operates by providing schools with grants of up to £600 to purchase resources for use in RE lessons. The scheme is open to state funded schools in England and Wales, with 40% awarded to secondary schools and 60% to primary schools. Grant availability during the school term, for both sectors, is notified on the website Home page.

What is World Environment Day?

World Environment Day is a United Nations international day. It aims to bring together people across the world and put the spotlight on the key environmental issues of our times.

In 2024, World Environment Day is being hosted by Saudi Arabia, with a focus on land restoration, desertification and drought resilience. The day brings millions of people from across the globe, engaging them to protect and restore the Earth. It serves as a platform for inspiring positive change and celebrates environmental action to create a more sustainable world.

It is a day to reflect on our relationship with the environment and what we can do as individuals and school communities to protect and improve it.

World Environment Day at school

It's a day to learn about the environment, participate in conservation activities, and learn about ways to help in the future. To celebrate at school, you can commune with nature, create new environmental programs, use nature-centered lesson plans, and work on earth-centered activities.

Ideas for schools

- Create a dedicated area within the school grounds where children can spend timer in nature
- Plan a lesson outside to plant flowers and trees.
- Be plastic conscious in the classroom. Implement ways to reduce plastic in schools or at home. You could have a plastic free week/month at school.
- Design a waste-free lunch to teach about reducing food waste and the importance of sustainable eating habits.
- Pupils can take part in a debate argument for and against the use of plastic, then write their own discursive text.


