Leadership and Governance Update

Leadership

The new CPD programme for the Autumn term is nearly ready and I would like to draw your attention to 2 courses of training in particular. The first of these is the <u>aspiring leaders</u> course. We have run this before and participants have commented on its emphasis on placing leadership in a Catholic context. It is designed to help those who have either just begun or who are hoping to begin in leadership and gives a good opportunity to work with colleagues from other schools and to share their experiences and expertise.

The second course is a new one for the new academic year. As many of our schools are facing declining numbers, we will be looking at the challenges facing <u>small schools</u> (1FE) and how to manage some of the issues which come from managing these situations. This course will run online over 3 weeks and is aimed at Heads, School business managers and Chairs of Governors. Even if your school is not yet being affected in this way, it may be useful to know how to pro-actively manage the situation should it arise in the future.

Details of how to book these courses along with costs will be in the CPD booklet.

RE and Catholic Life Resources

Ordinary Time

Ordinary Time between Pentecost and Advent is the longest liturgical period in the Catholic Church. It begins the day after Pentecost, which celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit, and continues until the eve of the First Sunday of Advent, which marks the beginning of the liturgical year. The primary theme of this period is spiritual growth through reflection on the teachings and miracles of Jesus Christ as recounted in the Gospels.

During these weeks, the Church emphasises what is means to be a disciple of Jesus. We are encouraged to reflect on how we can incorporate the teachings of



Jesus into our daily lives, promoting a deeper commitment to living out the values of the Gospel. The readings and liturgies focus on various aspects of Jesus' ministry, including parables, healings, and interactions with his disciples and the broader community. This time is seen as an opportunity for spiritual growth, personal reflection, and community building, helping believers to strengthen their faith and prepare for the more intense liturgical seasons of Advent and Christmas. Through Ordinary Time, we are reminded of the continual presence of God in the ordinary and the call to witness to our faith in everyday circumstances.

The Jerusalem Trust's Small Grants to Schools Scheme supports the teaching of Christianity within Religious Education. The scheme operates by providing schools with grants of up to £600 to purchase resources for use in RE lessons. The scheme is open to state funded schools in England and Wales, with 40% awarded to secondary schools and 60% to primary schools. Please come and join us for a talk about the extraordinary history of our site on Hammersmith Road from 1669 to the present day. A tale that involves the Catholic wives of Protest Kings supporting a clandestine convent at a time when it was illegal to be Catholic.

Links from the Gunpowder Plot to the Reign of Terror during the French Revolution; and to the extraordinary fortitude of the nuns who lived and worked here with occasional spells in gaol, the threat of execution and even an armed raid by militia.

Come and listen to what happened here with drinks afterwards and an opportunity to wander through our chapel, the cloisters and cloister garden, the reception room (with historical artefacts on display) and our front lawn, from which you can see evidence of the Benedictine memorial stones.

We are keen to share this story with local residents and interest groups as much as with our school community.

There is no cost attached to this event. Students can apply now and will have their place confirmed within a few weeks of application. We are encouraging students to apply as soon as possible.

Who is Taste of University for?

It is designed specifically for those in Year 12, or studying the first year of a Level 3 qualification in college. They support students as they find out about the opportunities available at university, how to find and apply for them too.

Across three days and nights in accommodation, participants will meet current students and lecturers, explore campus life, and have the chance to ask expert advisers any questions they might have. Most importantly, they'll have a great time too.

What happens at Taste of University?

Taste of University will give students the opportunity to find out everything they need to help with making decisions about their next steps. They will be able to:

- Experience the facilities and life on campus
- Explore support and extra-curricular opportunities
- Expand knowledge of UCAS applications, Student Finance, and Academic Skills
- Develop confidence and independence skills
- Meet current students, and ask questions

Taste of University: What Students Need To Know

Taste of University will run on Exton Park Campus in Chester from 9-12th July 2024. All meals, accommodation and activities are free of charge, however <u>applying for a place is essential</u>. All students in Year 12 are welcome to Taste of University. If the event is over-subscribed, priority will be given to students who are from groups currently under-represented at university under the following criteria:

- Are Black, Asian or Minority Ethnic background
- Are Living in Low Participation Neighbourhoods, particularly young, white males
- Have a disability or specific learning difference
- Have experience of local authority care
